I truly loved every minute I got to spend immersing myself in Indigenous culture, partaking in meaningful yarns, earning the trust and respect from the most vulnerable members of our community, and with that, being able to impart education on COVID-19 and the associated vaccinations. This enabled me to singlehandedly provide over 600 individual vaccinations to this most amazing cohort of fellow humans. I became their Deadly Wadjela or Deadly Nyarlu.

To say I feel truly blessed to have made such a huge impact on the health and well-being of our most vulnerable is an understatement, and has been the most rewarding of any nursing role of mine to date. So to receive such a special accolade as WANMEA Nurse of the Year recognising my work in this space, was an extra special blessing indeed.

Nursing is such a wonderful profession which provides so much diversity and opportunity. Although my time providing education and vaccinations came to a natural end with the decline of COVID-19 cases, I returned to my muchloved substantive role at Sir Charles Gairdner Hospital, caring for the chronically ill, a role I have worked in for 13 years.

I am so, so proud to call myself a nurse. I feel truly blessed every day caring for my patients, many of whom return for weekly, fortnightly or monthly infusions, who see my colleagues and I as part of their extended family. It is truly an honour to care for them.
